



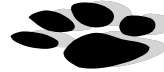
## Feline Preventative Health Care Plan



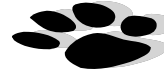
3 - 4 weeks old: Intestinal Parasite Deworming



7 - 8 weeks old: Intestinal Parasite Deworming  
1<sup>st</sup> FVRCP\* vaccination  
FeLV/FIV Testing  
Start flea and tick control



10-12 weeks old: Intestinal Parasite Deworming  
2<sup>nd</sup> FVRCP\* vaccination  
1<sup>st</sup> Leukemia\*\* vaccination



14-16 weeks old: Intestinal Parasite Deworming  
3<sup>rd</sup> FVRCP\* vaccination  
2<sup>nd</sup> Leukemia\*\* vaccination  
Rabies vaccination  
Start Monthly Heartworm Prevention



4 - 6 months old: Spay (female) or Neuter (male)



Yearly: Physical Examination  
FVRCP\* vaccination  
Leukemia\*\* vaccination  
Rabies vaccination  
Dental Cleaning



Seniors Yearly Recommendations  
Age 7 or older: Screening Bloodwork  
Chest and Abdominal X-Rays



## NUTRITION

- Have clean drinking water available at ALL times
- Feed a consistent, kitten/growth formula for first 1-2 years  
(We recommend *Science Diet Healthy Advantage Kitten*)
- Feed a consistent, quality adult diet after 1-2 years of age  
(We recommend *Science Diet Healthy Advantage Adult*)
- Feed a consistent, quality senior diet after 7 years of age  
(We recommend *Science Diet Healthy Advantage Senior*)
- Avoid table scraps and non-healthy treats
- Appropriate diet and exercise will lead to a better quality of life for your pet

\* FVRCP- vaccination for Feline Viral Rhinotrachitis, Calicivirus, and Panleukopenia virus

\*\*Leukemia- vaccination for Feline Leukemia virus (immunodeficiency virus)
